

Troop 422 Camping Personal Gear List

Miscellaneous Gear

- “smell-ables” ditty bag (items that go into the bear bag)
 - toothbrush/toothpaste
 - medicine
 - lip balm
- “personal” ditty bag (item that go inside the tent with you)
 - flash light or head lamp
 - pocket knife
 - two bandanas
- sleeping bag in stuff sack lined with plastic bag
- sleeping clothes
- pack straps or cords
- pack cover or heavy duty trash bag
- two large garbage bags
- two small plastic bags (like grocery bags)
- foam sleeping pad (closed cell or Thermo-Rest)
- toilet paper (in zip lock bag)
- eating
 - deep bowl (small, plastic or aluminum)
 - cup (measuring style)
 - spoon
 - 2 or 3 one quart water bottles

Clothing

Layer A (Hiking Clothes – All year)

- hiking boots--well broken in
- 2 pairs heavy socks (wool)
- 2 pairs lighter inner socks (polypro)
- 1 change of underwear
- 1 pair hiking shorts.
- 2 short sleeve shirts (not nylon)
- 1 hat or cap--flexible, with brim.

Layer B (Cool Evenings – March, April, October, November). All of the above plus:

- 1 long sleeve shirt (wool or flannel)
- 1 long pants (polypro or nylon, not heavy, not cotton)
- 1 pair insulated underwear (polypro)

Layer C (Cold – December, January, February). All of the above plus:

- 1 sweater or jacket (wool or polar fleece)
- 1 stocking cap (wool or polypro)
- 1 glove liners or mittens (wool or polypro)

Layer D (Cold, Wet, or Windy – All year, every trip)

- 1 sturdy rain suit
